Good Morning Mayor Gregg-

After conferring with Sheriff Cannon and County Legal, the Sheriff's Office will not enforce restricted access initiatives unless the Governor has declared Martial Law. As I'm sure you are aware, the Sheriff is concerned with ensuring Constitutional rights are not infringed during this challenging and constantly evolving event. The Sheriff's Office has, and continues to assist beach communities upon request; however, the deputies that are working these areas are responding to calls for service or assisting with traffic control that is not related to access of the community being served.

As for the plan for controlled access to Seabrook and Kiawah Islands if Martial Law was established, Captains Tommy Robertson and Don Martin can conduct a conference call to address any questions or concerns with that process. They are both very familiar with the area and are the most qualified to provide feedback. I've included them on this email so you can reach out directly.

I have attached a flyer regarding self-quarantine of out of state visitors that was distributed to Law Enforcement late yesterday and thought it could be helpful for you as well. At the Sheriff's direction we will attempt to educate the public when dealing with these situations. I'm sure that you may be issuing some flyers as property owners and renters arrive on the island as well as social media, I thought this version through DHEC might be helpful.
